Revising content

- Review notes from a recent class. This can take the form of ensuring notes are complete in enough detail or identifying areas of difficult content and using an effective revision method. (<u>flashcards/mind map/Cornell</u>).
- Revise content from an earlier part of the course. Use our RAG checklists (exam booklet in S3) to identify areas of concern and prioritise these. Use effective methods of revision to develop these key areas.
- Revision guides are available to use alongside class notes: <u>new</u> or <u>used</u>.
